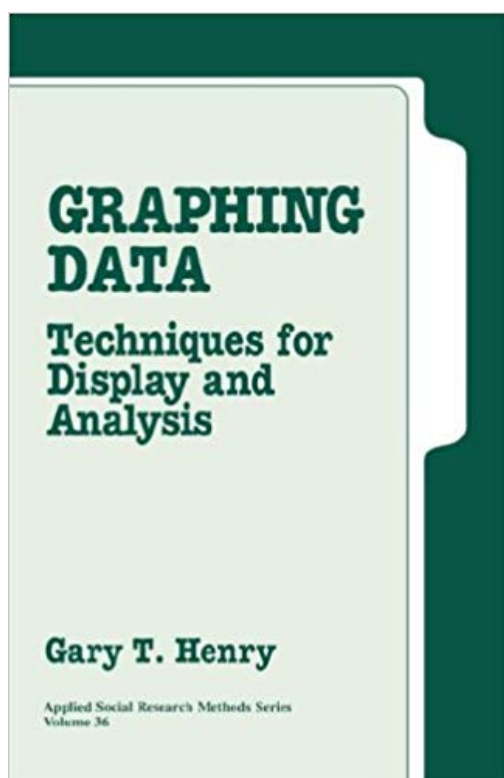


Graphing Data: Techniques for Display and Analysis (Applied Social Research Methods) by Gary T. Henry
