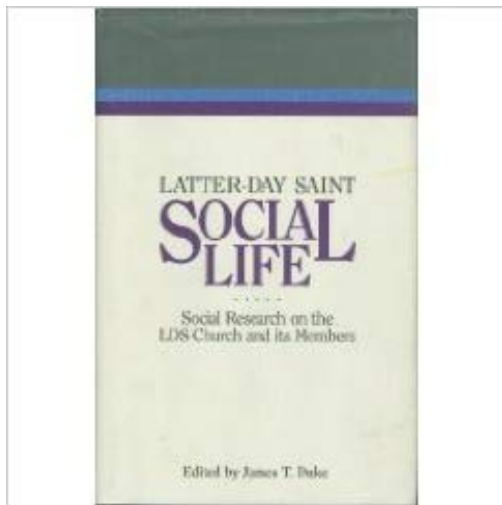

Religious sociology is actual statistical research on how certain religious cultures act and/or develop. This book is a compilation of famous articles about the current state of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and legitimate statistics about its members. So if you've ever heard the quote that by the end of the 21st century, the LDS church is supposed to have 260,000,000 members; Rodney Stark's article that led to that stat years ago is reprinted in this book. (It's worth buying just for that.) Another famous article that justifies buying the book is Brent L Top's article on the state of adolescents within the church (whether a higher percentage of kids "survive" inside/outside Utah, etc.) Anyone raising a family and deciding where to live needs to read that. Another important book to read is Rodney Starks' "Early Christianity."
